About this report:


- BACKGROUND: As part of the bi-annual District Inventory practice, District 5 sought to gain insight from it's groups and members. The primary and well established practice was to have GSRs meet with their respective groups to review 23 questions related to various aspects of District 5's state of affairs.
 - Concurrent with that process, the District 5 DCM Committee deployed a simple online survey with fewer questions, designed to seek individual AA member's insight.
- Feedback from the GSR Group Conscience sessions were reviewed at the GSR Sharing Session which preceded the May 17, 2016 District 5 Business Meeting, as were preliminary survey responses.
- CAUTION: Due to the limited number of respondents, the survey responses in this report are not fully representative of the District's opinions, feedback, etc. Instead, this data, especially the comments, helps us understand some opinions of some members. The report may be useful as a supplement to the primary District Inventory practice. Beware that the data shown (percentages and graphs) should be considered as directional in nature, and are not statistically representative of District 5.








COMMENTS – VERBATIM RESPONSES

- we have been upfront on finaces all along


Q5: IS THERE ENOUGH BEING DONE IN DISTRICT 5 TO PROMOTE SERVICE AND SPONSORSHIP?






COMMENTS - VERBATIM RESPONSES

Q8 DOES YOUR HOME GROUP'S GSR ATTEND AREA QUARTERLY ASSEMBLIES?









 would not be room in the space. Many meetings' attendance fluctuates seasonally, as do their finances.
 Therefore attendance at quarterlies may be dependent on the GSR's personal finances.
- There seems to be a lack of concern for service work in the Englewood area and I personally believe it is do to weak sponsorships.
